Additional Comments

- Even though he is brilliant and shows us what he can in the time he has, it's difficult to get past his accent. His handwriting is also difficult to read at times, which makes it hard to follow him. Once you catch up to him, he moves so quickly to a different topic that you mindlessly write what you see instead of understanding what he teaches. Other than that, he is an amazingly smart person that I would love to be able to learn more from.
- I found this class to be quite frusterating. The instructor is very knowlegable when it comes to calculus. He seems to be very smart but has difficulty understanding how to teach. It was frusterating to ask questions about math problems in the class and get a short answer that barely helped understand the problem. One on one he is more helpful than lecturing on calculus. I also found it frusterating that there were almost 8 tests and quizzes. I feel like the amount of tests and quizzes could be reduced and combined. This would help with more time to teach the class calculus.
- I think the instructor prepared well, but I hardly understand what he was saying. When teaching, he skip too many steps, which instead of pushing me to think more, it locks me off. In math, I think every step is important to explain. Skipping steps + hardly understanding what he is saying = lock me off. I think he needs to speaks more to explain.
- My professor (Yattselev) was extremely patient with me during office hours and helped me understand the material.

- Overall, Dr. Yattselev is a fantastic professor. He explains things clearly and simply, and he does a great job of teaching us why certain methods are used to solve equations, and why certain concepts are important to learn. He expresses concern when people are not doing well when they have been previously, and he seems to really care about giving us a solid understanding of calculus.

He sometimes seems a little exasperated with some questions asked during class, e.g., a student will ask him if we're talking about X, and he'll respond "yes, that's what we've been doing for the last five minutes," which might make people feel embarrassed or maybe apprehensive about asking questions. However, he will then explain what we've been doing and do his best to answer the question.

I look forward to taking Calc II with him.
