Prerequisite: By placement test or two years of high school algebra as evidenced by Math 110 or 111, with minimum grade C-.

M118 Course Description and Objectives: 3 credits. Topics include set theory, permutations, combinations, simple probability, conditional probability and independence, Bayes' theorem, Bernoulli trials, expected value and standard deviation, , matrix algebra, Linear programming and Markov chains.

Grade Scale: After taking the final, If your average is below 60% then it is *F* and if your average is:

90 -100% then it is (<i>A-</i> , <i>A</i>)	70-79% then it is (<i>C-</i> , <i>C</i> , <i>C+</i>)
80- 89% then it is (<i>B-</i> , <i>B</i> , <i>B+</i>)	60- 69% then it is (<i>D-</i> , <i>D</i> , <i>D+</i>)

Note The score of *A+* is only given to students with 98% as a final average after taking the final exam with an *A* in the final exam and a 97% or more in: in ALL tests (including the lowest) and in homework and attendance.

- **Incompletes:** Grades of Incomplete will only be given in accordance with the university policy available at <http://www.registrar.iupui.edu/incomp.html>. Specifically, students must be passing at the 3/4 mark of the semester to qualify for assigning an incomplete. The instructor must agree that an incomplete is appropriate and it must be approved by the Associate Chair of the Department of Mathematical Sciences.
- **Withdrawal Dates:** The last day to withdraw with a grade of *W* is November 11. You will need signatures from your instructor and advisor. **No drop slips will be signed after November 11. Do not depend on the Administrative Withdrawal: if you stop attending class without withdrawing, you will fail the class**

How Class-Work points is calculated: *Please read carefully*

- Homework problems are assigned and you are responsible to complete them in order to be prepared for the tests. Some homework assignments might be collected if needed, so please: always be prepared when the assignment is due. When a homework is collected, it will be counted as a quiz, with no delay or replacement
- During the lecture and at anytime, you will be asked one or two questions using the Attendance/Quiz sheet. The questions are mainly from homework that is due at the time, or from examples solved during the lecture of the quiz.
- If you answer correctly, then you will get points for attendance and the quiz. Otherwise, just for attendance for that day with zero or partial credit for the quiz.
- **Important:** Texting, using Smartphone or any electronic (except calculator) during the class means: -5 points for attendance and -5 points for the quiz involved.

In a way: It is better **not** to attend and get zero, than -5 points for penalty disturbing the class and the others around you.

The lowest of your four test scores will be DROPPED. **Tests 1-3 will be administered on desktop computers at the Testing Center in SL 070 during the scheduled testing periods (below).** You must take each test during the given testing period by making a **90-minute reservation using a reservation link** in Canvas (a separate handout with more detailed information about computer testing and making reservations will be posted later). Computer tests are designed to take about 75 minutes, but the time limit is set at 90 minutes to allow for downtime due to technology issues that can arise during computer testing.
