Grade Scale: After taking the final, If your average is below 60% then it is F and if your average is:

90 -100% then it is (A-, A)	70-79% then it is (<i>C</i> -, <i>C</i> , <i>C</i> +)
80-89% then it is (<i>B</i> -, <i>B</i> , <i>B</i> +)	60- 69% then it is (<i>D</i> -, <i>D</i> , <i>D</i> +)

Note The score of A+ is only given to students with 98% as a final average after taking the final exam with an A in the final exam and a 97% or more in: in ALL tests (including the lowest) and in homework and attendance.

- Incompletes: Grades of Incomplete will only be given in accordance with the university policy available at http://www.registrar.iupui.edu/incomp.html. Specifically, students must be passing at the 3/4 mark of the semester to qualify for assigning an incomplete. The instructor must agree that an incomplete is appropriate and it must be approved by the Associate Chair of the Department of Mathematical Sciences
- Withdrawal Dates: The last day to withdraw leaving no record is January 18. The last day to withdraw with a grade of W is April 17th. You will need signatures from your instructor and advisor. No drop slips will be signed after April 17. Do not depend on the Administrative Withdrawal: if you stop attending class without withdrawing, you will fail the class.

Homework and Attendance: By the end of the semester (*please read carefully*):

- If you have and keep 85% or more Class-Work, then:
 - 1. The final exam score will be curved (read more about it below in the final exam section)
 - 2. Your lowest score of test 1, 3, 4 or the midterm may be replaced by your percentage score on the final, if it is beneficial to you. Note that we are offering only one replacement for one test only.
- If you have less than 85%, but more than 65% in Class-Work, then:
 - 1. Failing the final exam or the Midterm means failing the whole course.
 - 2. No lowest score will be replaced
 - 3. The score of the final exam will not be curved and no partial credits will be given in grading it.
 - 4. The highest grade for the semester is B- (regardless of tests or final exam scores)
- If you have less than 65% in Class-Work, then your grade for the semester will be *F* regardless of your scores in the tests, and you must officially withdraw (school policy) before the deadline (**April 17, 2015**). The final exam will not be graded or counted if taken.
- Missing a test is a zero and <u>cannot be dropped or replaced</u> by any score.

<u>Final Exam</u>: Technically, it is calculated as 25% of your total, but it does play a major role in deciding your final grade for the semester if your final exam score is very high or very low.

If you have more than 85% in attendance and homework (the higher, the better):

- Getting an A in the final does not mean an automatic A for the semester, unless your calculated average after taking it is an A.
 - However, your final grade of the semester might be raised one step higher than what it was technically calculated after taking the final. This will depend on how good your final exam score and your Class-Work score.
- Getting an *F* in the final does not mean an automatic *F* for the semester, unless your calculated average after taking it is *F* or your homework and attendance is less than 85%.
 - However, your final grade of the semester might be dropped one step lower than what it was technically calculated after taking the final. This will depend on how low your final exam score and your Class-Work score.

<u>Important</u>: Getting less than 50% in the final exam means an *F* for the course regardless of your final average before or after taking the final exam. However, almost no one with good Class-Work has ever faced that situation yet. It is the department policy that absolutely no make-up for the final.

Missing the final means an (F) as a final grade

How Class-Work points is calculated: (*Please read carefully*)

- Homework problems are assigned and you are responsible to complete them in order to be prepared for the tests. **Some homework assignments might be collected** if needed, so please: Always be prepared when the assignment is due. When a homework is collected, it will be counted as a quiz, with no delay or replacement.
- During the lecture and at anytime, you will be asked one or two questions using the Attendance/Quiz sheet. The questions are mainly from homework that is due at the time, or from examples solved during the lecture of the quiz.
- If you answer correctly, then you will get points for attendance and the quiz. Otherwise, just for attendance for that day with zero or partial credit for the quiz.
- **Important**: Texting, using Smartphone or any electronic (except calculator) during the class means: -5 points for attendance and -5 points for the quiz involved.

In a way: It is better <u>not</u> to attend and get zero, than -5 points for penalty disturbing the class and the others around you.

• In calculating the Class-Work points:

Lowest 2 attendances will be dropped

Lowest 2 quizzes will be dropped
